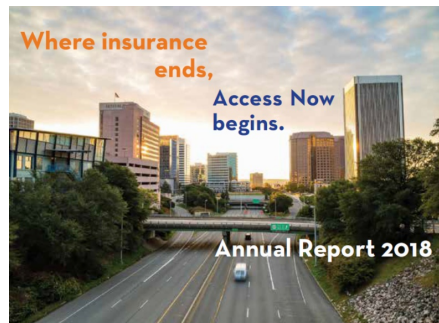
## Caring for a Caregiver

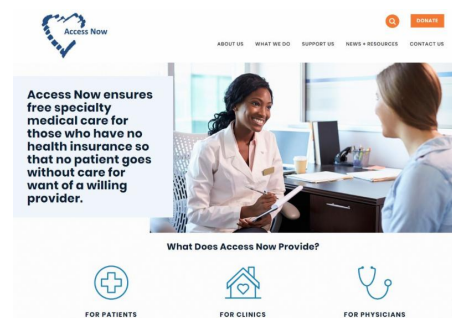

## Introducing Access Now's New Website



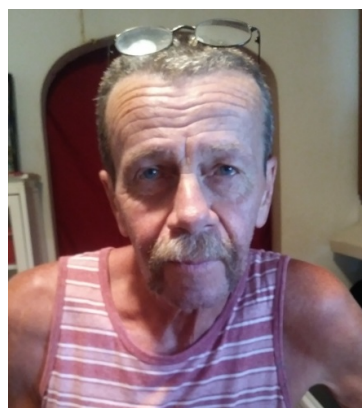
