Medical Interpreters: An Important Part of the Care Team



Imagine that you desperately need medical care, but you can't speak the language. How would you be able to communicate to your physician?

It's a reality for many people living in Central Virginia.

Medical interpreters facilitate communication between patients and providers who speak different languages. They can help explain cultural differences that could affect health care delivery.

Becoming a medical interpreter is more than being bilingual. Trained interpreters must also understand medical terminology and know how to mediate any cultural misunderstanding. They must hold a certificate from a credited interpreter training program.

"I interpret to be the voice for people who often don't have one because of a language barrier," says volunteer **Kelly Grzech**. "Patients sometimes arrive anxious and confused about their health issue, but through interpreting I am able to help them feel more at ease and in control of their health, a luxury native English speakers often take for granted."

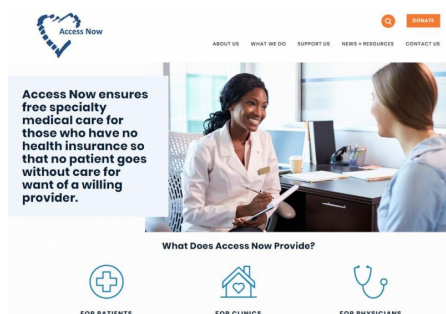
