FHASES Upgrade Grants Improved Access for Referring Clinics

A new software enhancement within Access Now has enabled our partner **referring clinics** to enter their own information into our system. It's the latest upgrade designed to streamline care for our patients.

Access Now held a Zoom training class for all referring clinics to learn the ins and outs of the virtual improvement. Two clinics a week also received personalized training and troubleshooting to



master the new capabilities in our **Fhases** (**Family Health Administration System - Electronic Services**) system.

All referring clinics have now been trained and are able to enter their referrals directly into Fhases, thereby improving the efficiency and processing times for patient referrals.

In Memoriam: Hazle Konerding, MD, 1947-2024

Access Now lost a true and devoted friend with the passing of **Hazle S. Konerding, MD**, on Monday, June 17.

Dr. Konerding was a founding member and, at the time of her death, Treasurer of the Access Now Board of Directors. Hailing from Alaska, Dr. Konerding found her home in Richmond following completion of her residency in 1977. The first thirty years of her practice in Richmond culminated in her participation in Access Now's founding in 2008, further fulfilling her devotion to bettering the health of our community.

She was a veritable trailblazer, becoming "a physician in an era when few women chose to enter medicine, much less seek leadership positions," as her obituary notes. Besides her instrumental role in the creation of Access Now, her resume of volunteerism in a host of organizations stands testament to her tremendous, unwavering spirit of service. A Founding Partner and President of Commonwealth Dermatology, Dr. Konerding also served as a past president of the Richmond Academy of Medicine (1993), among a litany of other organizations.



A natural leader, Dr. Konerding's authoritative presence belied her small frame. Exhibiting an aura of calm and confidence, as well as an impeccable sense of style, she commanded the respect of her peers while earning their love. Her dedication to her patients and her passion for legislative advocacy leave benchmarks for all to aspire to reach.

She is survived by her devoted husband, Karsten Konerding, MD; two daughters; and four grandchildren.

Access Now Maintains NAFC Gold Rating Yet Again



Access Now is proud to have earned a **2024 Gold Rating** from the **National Association of Free and Charitable Clinics Quality Standards Program** for the fifth year running, having received the Gold Seal each time it has been shared since 2020.

NAFC Quality Standards elements include policies and procedures related to the following areas: Administrative, Enhanced Access and Continuity of Care, Identifying and Managing Patient Population information, Planning and Managing Care, Providing Self-Care Support and Community Resources, Tracking and Coordinating Care and Measuring and Improving Performance.

Access Now serves thousands of uninsured patients in the Richmond area, connecting them

with specialty providers who volunteer their time to ensure that no one goes without care.

Up to 15 of the Type 2 continuing education hours may be satisfied through delivery of services, without compensation, to low-income individuals receiving services through a local health department or a free clinic organized in whole or primarily for the delivery of health services. One hour of continuing education may be credited for one hour of providing such volunteer services. For the purpose of continuing education credit for voluntary service, documentation by the health department or free clinic shall be acceptable.

Access Now's Interpreter Class a Success



Access Now proudly partnered with <u>Liberty Language Services</u> through the <u>Virginia</u>

<u>Poverty Law Center</u> to host an <u>interpreter training class</u> to area free clinics this past May.

Because most free clinics already run a tight ship, we spread the class over two weeks to guarantee minimal interruption to valuable services.

Out of ten participants, eight successfully completed the language proficiency test to become qualified interpreters. Access Now is particularly proud that two of the new interpreters are Access Now employees!

The Apple of our Eye: Quality Optical Care Collaboration



Many under- and uninsured people are particularly susceptible to **diabetes**. Unfortunately, oftentimes the earliest signs of the disease go unnoticed, especially when the patient is unable to afford a doctor's visit.

That's why Access Now, <u>MEDRVA Healthcare</u>, and <u>CrossOver Healthcare Ministry</u> have partnered to offer a no-cost eye care program to at-risk patients. These **diabetic eye screenings** check their eyes for problems, often before they notice any changes

in their sight. Finding and treating **diabetic retinopathy** early can reduce and prevent damage to their eyes and sight loss.

Our joint eye program is in full swing this summer! Since January, we've been able to complete screens for **53** patients. By helping catch and treat diabetes early, we are lessening future burden on the health care system. Thanks to our partners and staff for making it possible!
